Responsibilities:

Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC)

- Support the implementation and evaluation of the home's IPAC program in accordance with Public Health Ontario (PHO), Ministry of Long-Term Care (MLTC), and IPAC Canada guidelines.
- Conduct regular audits (e.g., hand hygiene, PPE use, environmental cleaning) and provide feedback to front-line staff.
- Assist in outbreak prevention, preparedness, and response, including surveillance, contact tracing, reporting, and documentation.
- Promote and model proper use of PPE and adherence to infection control protocols throughout the facility.
- Participate in the education and orientation of staff on IPAC policies, procedures, and updates.
- Monitor and support compliance with resident isolation, cohorting, and screening practices.
- Keep current with emerging infections, provincial directives, and updated IPAC guidelines.
- Support Educator with Mask Fit testing.
- Participate in providing immunizations to residents and staff.

Clinical and Collaborative Support

- Work in collaboration with the IPAC Lead, DOC, and interdisciplinary care team to ensure consistent infection control practices.
- Participate in committees and quality improvement initiatives related to IPAC as requested.
- Provide occasional clinical support within RPN scope when needed, especially during outbreaks or staff shortages, ensuring IPAC principles are maintained.
- Provide back-up support to the Nursing Supply position.
- Manager/Designate may redeploy if required.
- Perform all other duties as assigned.

Qualifications: Current Certificate of Competence with College of Nurses of Ontario. Knowledge of electronic ordering system, basic knowledge of budgeting of supplies. Advanced education/training in wound care would be an asset. The applicant must be able to perform the essential duties of the position as detailed in the "Physical Demands Analysis" document for the position. Must participate in IPAC education as required.

Promotions or transfers within the bargaining unit shall be awarded to the senior applicant able to meet the normal requirements of the job.
